

Horticultural Section Rules The Horticultural Section is open to all who wish to exhibit their produce at the Show, regardless of experience. Everyone is welcome!

- **1.** ENTRY FORMS. All intending exhibitors must send a completed entry form to the Secretary of the Horticultural section.
- EXTRA ENTRY FORMS. Can be obtained by sending a stamped addressed envelope to the Secretary of the section or by downloading an entry form from the web site – www.chepstowshow.co.uk
- **3.** ENTRIES. Competitors are restricted to one entry per class. As of 2024, there is no entry fee.

A competitor entering 12 or more classes is entitled to one free entry pass to the showground otherwise all entrants must pay to enter the showground.

Please enclose a stamped addressed envelope with your entry form to receive your free ticket with 12 entries or more.

3.1 It is also permissible to send entry forms via email to the Secretary (rebecca_utting@talk21.com)

- 4. IDENTIFICATION OF EXHIBITS. For each exhibit, competitors are requested to put their names and addresses in a plain, sealed envelope with the Class number on the outside, which is to be placed underneath the exhibit before judging takes place.
- 5. All produce must be grown by the exhibitor submitting the Entry Form. The Committee shall have the right to examine any exhibitor's garden or allotment.
- 6. Exhibits may be staged from 4:00pm until 6:00pm on Friday 9th August 2024 AT EXHIBITOR'S OWN RISK. There will be noone in attendance overnight. Stewards will be in attendance from 4:00pm until 6:00pm on Friday 9th August for advice and information.

All exhibits must be staged for the judges by **9.30am** on Show Day at which time the Exhibition Tent will be cleared of everyone other than the officials appointed by the Committee. No exhibit is to be removed before **4.30pm** without the consent of the Section Secretary. All exhibits must be cleared from the Tent by 6.00pm.

- 7. The decision of the Judges will be final. They shall have the power to withhold prizes where they consider they are not merited or where there are insufficient entries.
- 8. Objections must be made in writing and lodged with the secretary by 2.00pm on the day of the Show. As a guarantee of good faith, objectors must lodge £10 which will be forfeited if the Committee pronounce the objections to be frivolous. PRIZE MONEY will be available from the Secretary between 2.30pm and 4pm. Prize money not collected between those times may be forfeited.
- 9. CUPS will be presented at 3.30pm in the Show Tent. All cups shall be returned to the Secretary by 6th August in the following year. For the purpose of deciding the winners of Challenge Cups points will be awarded as follows:-

Classes 1-3,36,52	1^{st} - 5 points 3^{rd} - 2 points	2^{nd} - 3 points
All other classes	1 st – 3 points 3 rd – 1 point	$2^{nd} - 2$ points

- **10.** The Committee shall have the power to reject any entry without being under any obligation to give a reason for such a rejection. In such a case the entry fee paid shall be returned to the exhibitor.
- 11. RESPONSIBILITY. The Society, its Officers and servants shall not be responsible for any damage caused by them or any article or property exhibited by them and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto and repay any injury which might be so occasioned.
