Pollinator-friendly Flowers Suitable for Containers compiled by Transition Chepstow member Marc Carlton

Pollinator-friendly plants are those which are rich in nectar and pollen and many can be grown in containers. This list includes suggestions of both annuals and perennials, concentrating on smaller kinds suitable for containers. Note that so-called 'double' flowers (i.e. those where the pollen-bearing stamens have been replaced by rows of extra petals) should always be avoided. The only exception to this rule is *Zinnia*, where flowers with extra rows of petals still produce pollen and nectar. Never use pesticides on plants when they are in flower.

Annuals

Trailing Lobelia (Lobelia erinus) Nasturtium (Tropaeolum majus) Sweet Alyssum (Lobularia maritima) Dwarf Morning Glory or Annual Convolvulus (Convolvulus tricolor) French Marigolds (Tagetes patula) : single-flowered strains only Tagetes (Tagetes tenuifolia) Annual Candytuft (Iberis umbellata) California Bluebell (Phacelia campanularia) Annual Lupins (dwarf forms of Lupinus) Fern-leaved Beggarticks Bidens ferulifolia (a widely available bedding plant) Dwarf Bugloss (Echium plantagineum 'Blue Bedder') Iceland Poppies (*Papaver nudicaule*) Poached Egg Plant (Limnanthus douglasii) Cornflower (Centaurea cyanus) : single-flowered strains only Dwarf strains of Zinnia Mignonette (Reseda odorata) Clary (Salvia horminum) Bishop's flower (Ammi majus) White Lace Flower (Orlava grandiflora)

Perennials

Rock Rose (Helianthemum species and hybrids) Thymes (*Thymus* species) Hyssop (Hyssopus officinalis) Betony (Stachys officinalis) Germander (Teucrium species) Sages (Salvia: blue, mauve and white-flowered species and hybrids) Aniseed Hyssop (Agastache: blue, mauve and white-flowered species and hybrids) Fuchsia : single-flowered varieties only Cranesbill (Geranium species and hybrids; not Pelargonium) Stonecrops (Sedum) Houseleeks (Sempervivium) Dwarf forms of Michaelmas Daisy (Aster) :single-flowered strains only Dwarf forms of Dahlia : single-flowered strains only Lavenders (Lavandula) Catmints (Nepeta) Silver Knapweed (Centaurea cinereria 'Silver Feather') : sold as a foliage plant but allow it to flower Mints (Mentha) Heaths and Heathers (*Calluna* and *Erica* species and varieties, but must be single-flowered) Yarrow (Achillea species and hybrids) Harebell (*Campanula glomerata* and *C. rotundifolia*) Cinquefoils (Potentilla)
